WHAT IS INTELEXIT?

We are the world's first exit program for the intelligence community. We help people working in the secret services, like the National Security Agency (NSA) and UK Government Communications Headquarters (GCHQ), find a way to get out.

We provide help in the following ways:

- Counseling to solve conflicts of conscience.
- Evidence-based arguments to dispel myths about the benefits of surveillance and drone warfare.
- Suggestions about other professional fields.
- Help with your resignation letter.
- A large network of organisations and individuals who offer legal, psychological and advocacy support for this cause.

WHY LEAVE THE SECRET SERVICE?

The main reason to leave your job at the secret service is because you feel a strong moral conflict between your own values and the activities you are either directly or indirectly involved in.

You could leave the secret service because:

- You value your country's constitution and cannot stand by and watch it be undermined.
- You don't believe that mass surveillance and drone warfare are just nor effective solutions to the problem of terrorism.
- You think that the activities and spending of intelligence agencies should not be hidden from the public.
- You've had enough of paranoia and want to learn to trust people again.
- You want to be able to talk about your work successes and failures with friends and family.

KNOW SOMEONE WORKING IN THE SECRET SERVICE?

Even if you are not an intelligence agent yourself, you can still help. If you know someone who is working in intelligence, you can guide them slowly towards the decision to exit.

To do this you can:

- Start a conversation about ethics in career choice.
- Remind them about why democracy is good for the world, and surveillance and drone warfare are not.
- Start sending them new interesting job opportunities that match their skills.
